Library cards are available to residents living in the Town of Rensselaerville and the Greenville School District. Come into the library with a proof of residence -- driver's license or a utility bill -- complete an application and we will happily issue you a library card.

Account Access Is Easy!

Visit the library's website and click on the "Search the Catalog" button or download the Upper Hudson Library System app to access our collection using the barcode on your card (no spaces). Your PIN is the last 4 digits of the phone number you gave us when you applied for your card.

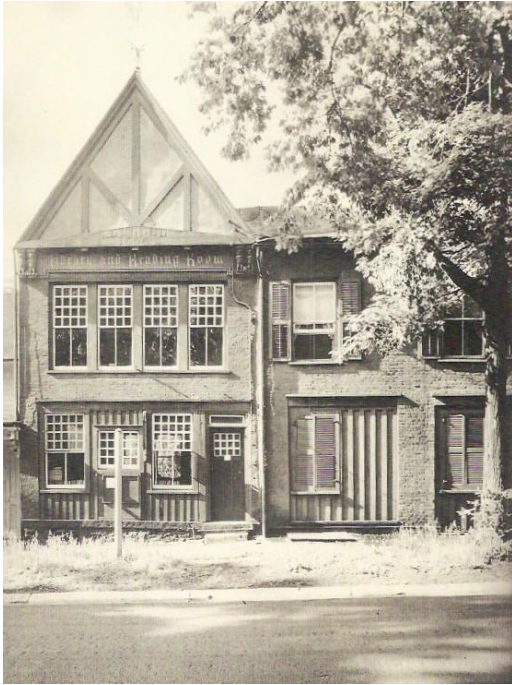

Historic Reading Room

Our History

Federal Library

Dating from 1798, the library in Rensselaerville was the first library in Albany County, with 186 patrons. It featured 200 books, which were kept in different parts of town, wherever space could be found.

Reading Room

The library was discontinued in 1832. The present library was organized in 1896 as a “Reading Room” in the row house where it is today. Francis Conkling Huyck, Sr. purchased and renovated the building in 1906.

A Library of Proper Standard

In 1921, the Library was chartered as an association library by the State of New York Department of Education and charged to serve the entire Town of Rensselaerville. To this day, the Library is governed by a Board of Trustees and meets all current New York State Library standards.

Today’s Library

In 1995, the Library acquired the adjacent property and created the Ann Ballinger Annex. Since 2009, the Library has undergone extensive renovations to accommodate a growing collection and address accessibility. Today’s library collection includes more than 15,000 items and 700-plus card-carrying members.

Board of Trustees

The Library Board of Trustees meet on the third Tuesday of most months at 7:00 p.m. The annual meeting is held in September. All meetings are open to the public.

Support the Library

Although the Library is funded in part by the Town of Rensselaerville and Greenville School District, half of our annual budget is supported by fundraising events and donations.
